Fund Description

The PowerShares Dynamic Building & Construction Portfolio is based on the Dynamic Building & Construction Intellidex. The Fund will normally invest at least 90% of its total assets in common stocks that comprise the Index. The Intellidex thoroughly evaluates companies based on a variety of investment merit criteria, including fundamental growth, stock valuation, investment timeliness and risk factors. The Underlying Intellidex is comprised of stocks of 30 U.S. building and construction companies. These are companies that are primarily engaged in providing construction and related engineering services for building and remodeling residential properties, commercial or industrial buildings, or working on large-scale infrastructure projects, such as highways, tunnels, bridges, dams, power lines and airports.

There are risks involved with investing in ETFs, including possible loss of money. Shares are not actively managed and are subject to risks similar to those of stocks, including those regarding short selling and margin maintenance requirements. Ordinary brokerage commissions apply. 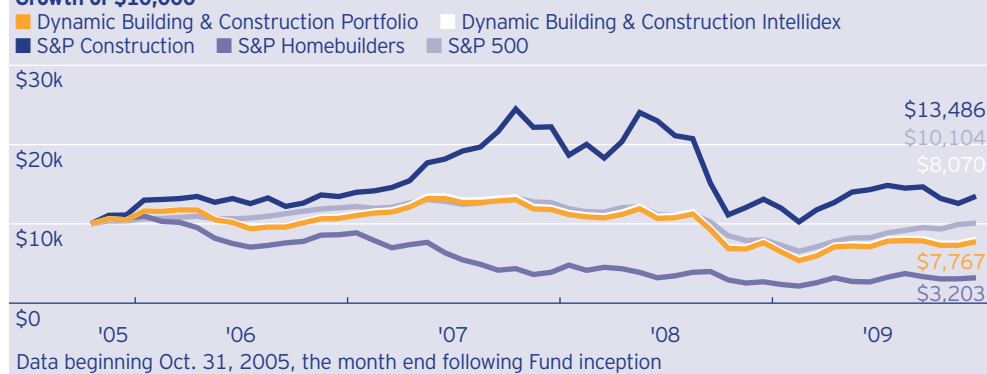

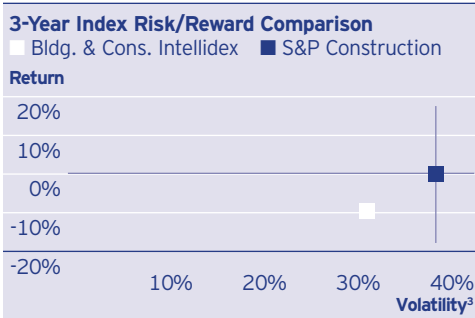

Sharpe Ratio is a risk-adjusted measure calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. A higher Sharpe Ratio indicates better risk-adjusted performance.

Correlation indicates the degree to which two investments have historically moved in the same direction and magnitude.

Alpha is a measure of performance on a risk-adjusted basis.

Stock Price-to-Earnings Ratio is the share price divided by earnings per share. It is measured on a 12-month trailing basis.

Stock Price-to-Book-Value Ratio is the ratio of a stock's market price to a company's net asset value.

Weighted Harmonic Average is a method of calculating an average value that lessens the impact of large outliers and increases the impact of small ones.

Weighted Average Return on Equity is net income divided by net worth.

Weighted Market Capitalization is the sum of each underlying securities' market value.
