Fund Description

The PowerShares MENA Frontier Countries Portfolio is based on the NASDAQ OMX Middle East North Africa IndexSM. The Fund will normally invest at least 80% of its total assets in securities that comprise the Index and American depository receipts and global depository receipts based on the securities in the Index.

The Index seeks to provide direct exposure to liquid stocks of companies residing in MENA frontier market countries, which include Kuwait, Bahrain, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, Oman, Lebanon, Egypt, Jordan and Morocco.

There are risks involved with investing in ETFs, including possible loss of money. Shares are not actively managed and are subject to risks similar to those of stocks. Ordinary brokerage commissions apply. An investment in securities of frontier market countries involves risks not associated with investments in securities of developed countries.

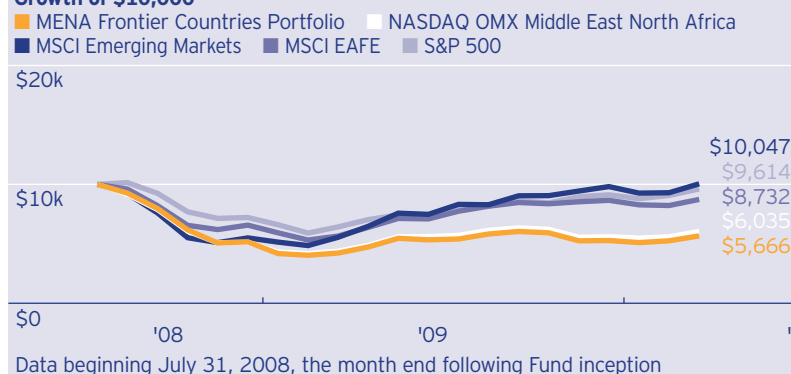

Volatility is the annualized standard deviation of index returns.

Beta is a measure of relative risk and the slope of regression.

Sharpe Ratio is a risk-adjusted measure calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. A higher Sharpe Ratio indicates better risk-adjusted performance.

Correlation indicates the degree to which two investments have historically moved in the same direction and magnitude.

Alpha is a measure of performance on a risk-adjusted basis.

Stock Price-to-Earnings Ratio is the share price divided by earnings per share. It is measured on a 12-month trailing basis.

Stock Price-to-Book-Value Ratio is the ratio of a stock's market price to a company's net asset value.

Weighted Harmonic Average is a method of calculating an average value that lessens the impact of large outliers and increases the impact of small ones.

Weighted Average Return on Equity is net income divided by net worth.

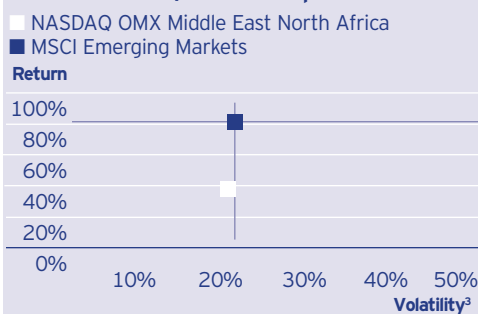
Weighted Market Capitalization is the sum of each underlying securities' market value.

heavy dependency upon international trade that has been and may continue to be, adversely affected by trade barriers, exchange controls, managed adjustments in relative currency values and other protectionist measures imposed or negotiated by the countries with which they trade, and risks associated with certain foreign governments in countries in which the Fund invests levy withholding or other taxes on dividend and interest income, sanctions or embargoes imposed by the U.S. government and the United Nations and/or countries identified by the U.S. government as state sponsors of terrorism and foreign investment holdings limitations, among others.

The Fund initially expects to invest up to 20% of its net assets in P-notes in seeking to track the performance of Kuwaiti securities included in the Underlying Index.

P-notes generally are issued by banks or broker-dealers and are promissory notes designed to offer a return linked to the performance of a particular underlying equity security or market. The return on a P-note linked to a particular underlying security generally is increased by any dividends paid in connection with the underlying security. The holder of a P-note typically does not receive voting rights as it would if it directly owned the underlying security. P-notes constitute direct, general and unsecured contractual obligations of the banks or broker-dealers issuing them, which subjects the Fund to counterparty risk.

P-notes involve certain risks in addition to those associated with a direct investment in the underlying foreign companies or foreign securities markets whose returns they seek to replicate. There can be no assurance that there will be a trading market for a P-note or that the trading price will equal the underlying value of the foreign company or foreign securities market. The Fund relies on the creditworthiness of the counterparty issuing the P-note and has no rights under a P-note against the issuer of the underlying security. If the counterparty were to become insolvent, the Fund would lose its investment. The risk that the Fund may lose its investments due to counterparty insolvency may be amplified because the Fund intends to purchase P-notes issued by as few as one issuer. In seeking to limit counterparty risk, the Fund will limit investment in P-notes of any one issuer to \$5 million at the time of purchase and to counterparties who meet the creditworthiness standard required of issuers whose securities are eligible for investment by money market funds. P-notes include transaction costs in addition to those applicable to a direct investment. P-notes may

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cause the Fund's performance to deviate from the performance of the portion of the Underlying Index to which the Fund is gaining exposure through the use of P-notes.

Liquidity and transfer restrictions may cause the secondary markets on which P-notes are traded to be less liquid than the markets for other securities – or completely illiquid – which may lead to the absence of readily available market quotations and delays in the redemption of Fund Shares. In addition, the Fund's ability to value its securities becomes more difficult and the judgment in the application of fair value procedures may play a greater role in the valuation of the Fund's securities due to reduced availability of reliable objective pricing data. Consequently, while such determinations will be made in good faith, it may be more difficult for the Fund to accurately assign a daily value to such securities.
